## Prayer of Confession

(from a prayer by Matthew Henry)

Lord, we confess we have sinned against you, we have done foolishly,  
very foolishly, for foolishness is bound up in our hearts: We have sinned  
and have come short of the glory of God: We have come short of  
glorifying you, and deserve to come short of being glorified with you.

The imagination of our hearts is evil continually, and the bias of our  
corrupt natures is very strong toward the world and the flesh and the  
gratifications of sense; but towards God and Christ and heaven, we  
move slowly and with a great many stops and pauses.

In fact, there is in our carnal mind a wretched aversion to divine and  
spiritual things. We have misspent our time, trifled away our  
opportunities, and have followed after lying vanities...God be merciful to  
us, sinners! For how little have we done, since we came into the world,  
of the great work that we were sent into the world about...

Let the blood of Christ, which speaks better things than that of Abel, be  
sprinkled upon our consciences, to purify and pacify them: Let us be
