Isaiah 62

¹For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch.

²The nations shall see your righteousness, and all the kings our glory, and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the LORD will give.

³You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

⁴You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married (Beulah).

⁵For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

Two Shining Ones

- Hebrews 1:14
- "Are they not all ministering spirits sent out to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation?"

The Unavoidable River/Passing Through the River

- 2 Samuel 22:5
- "For the waves of death encompassed me, the torrents of destruction assailed me."
- Isaiah 43:1-3
- "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you. When you walk through the fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

Passing Through the River

Preparing ourselves for death:

- Remember the depravity of man and your own sin nature. Genesis 6:5 "The LORD saw that the
 wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart
 was only evil, continually."
- Remember the salvation as offered by God to his people. Isaiah 62:12. "And they shall be called The Holy People, The Redeemed of the LORD; and you shall be called Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken." Your sin is forgiven by the righteousness of Christ not of your own.
- Remember the deeds God has done for you and on his character. Psalm 145:5-7 "On the
 glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate. They shall
 speak of the might of your awesome deeds, and I will declare your greatness. They shall pour
 forth the fame of your abundant goodness and shall sing aloud of your righteousness."
- Remember Biblical truths about death. 1 Corinthians 15:55 "Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is your victory, O death, where is your sting?"
- Pray to have an eternal perspective and even be able to look forward to death. Philippians 1:21 "For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." Rev 22:20 "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!"

What the Pilgrims Can Expect Ahead

Will return to the City with Christ

A Glad Procession to the Gate

- Revelation 19:9

- Bunyan describes their feeling:
- "But what gave them the greatest joy of all was the thought that thy
 themselves could be so fully accepted as to be invited to make their
 own dwelling here with such companions—not just for a short time,
 but for ever and ever. Oh, how could tongue or pen ever express such
 rapturous joy!"

They Gain Entrance to the City

- Revelation 22:14 "Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and that they may enter the city by the gates."
- Isaiah 26:2 "Open the gates, that the righteous nation that keeps faith may enter in."
- Revelation 5:13 "To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!"
- Revelation 4:8 "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come."
